In order to receive a ballot, the voter's name MUST be a member in good standing on the membership records of the Vecinos and you must know your Manzana and Lote number. If you cannot be in Cholla Bay for the general meeting, we encourage you to let your voice be heard through a proxy. Each voting Vecino is permitted only one proxy vote per paid membership. The Power of Attorney (Proxy) form, to permit someone to vote at the *Vecinos* meeting in your place, must be *notarized*. The proxy form with a ballot is included in this newsletter. If you do not have someone to vote your proxy, you may mail it to our PO Box 620, Lukeville AZ 85341. If you do NOT designate someone to vote your proxy, please see section B part 3 of the voting procedures on page six (6) of this newsletter.



The general assembly will be asked to elect the treasurer and one Board member (3 year terms). The assembly will be asked to approve the minutes of the April 2016 general meeting, the prior year's financial reports, an operating budget for 2017-2018 with supporting annual dues and to take action with respect to the admission, exclusion, revocation or suspension of members. # Earth Day Cleanup Planned in Cholla

A Cholla Bay Clean-up Day will be conducted on Earth Day, April 22, by the Keep Cholla Beautiful Committee, and volunteers are invited to help. The trash trek will begin at noon at the Homeowners Associ-

ation Community Center, also known as the Old Boys Social Club, and last for one hour. Just show up at the clubhouse, across from Firecracker Park a little before noon. It will be followed by refreshments and each participant will receive a thank-you gift from the Association. Volunteers can choose to clean the busiest streets or the area by their own homes in LaCholla, or they can do a shoreline clean-up. Attention is particularly needed in the estuary area at the south end of Cholla Bay where no trash service is provided. The committee conducted a similar clean-up day on Oct. 22 last year in conjunction with the Puerto Peñasco Beach Clean-up Day. That day, three dozen workers collected more than 90 bags of



trash and a pickup bed full of large discarded items such as furniture, tires and car parts. Bags will be provided and prizes will be awarded for the most trash collected by a team, by an individual, and for the most unusual find. The winning team for the October event included Monica Gorman, Jeff Eckblad and Barbara Baird. The individual collecting the most trash was Kathy Van Holton and the trophy for the most unusual find – a thoroughly sea-encrusted rod and reel with a trigger fish attached – went to the team of Oliver Maud. Following the Saturday event, workers from Oomislim brought out a trailer and transported the trash to the city dump. The April 22 event is also an opportunity for Cholla homeowners to have large items hauled away. ## Mexico's New 911 System

In November 2014, the new 911 service was annouced by Mexican President Pena Nieto. Since January 1 of this year, you can access ALL emergency services in Mexico by dialing the familiar "911". As in the US, it is available 24/7, 365 days a year. This service replaces the old 000 codes for each type of emergency. It is claimed this newly activated service will be more

trustworthy, realiable and faster than the old system. Integrated control centers are in place to

automatically geo-reference and route the call to the closest call center. 911 services can be reached for free on either cell phones and land lines. The Mexican 911 will contain hyphens, 9-1-1, to separate new their system from the American emergency system.

In response to concerns of Vecinos living on Calle F (the Main Drag), a new speed bump has been placed near the Cholla Mini Mart. The speed bump has been paint-

ed twice, but due to all of the blowing sand and traffic, the paint quickly has worn off. There will be warning signs placed at the new speed control bump in both directions, but painting the bump is basically useless. Existing speed bumps are periodically maintained to insure their effectiveness. To request a speed bump in your neighborhood, the Board asks that all neighbors near a proposed speed bump sign a petition supporting its construction. At that point Kelly Ross, Vecinos Vice President and Roads Czar, will determine whether the speed bump will be added to our speed control arsenal.



By request of several Vecinos, Firecracker Park now has a Pickelball court. The current court is being shared with the basketball hoopsters. Thanks to Darrell Smith, Vecinos board member, we are planning a brand new dedicated court for our Pickelball players. Watching Pickelball players of all ages has inspired the question: *What game are they playing*? Pickelball was invented in the

mid-1960's on an island near Seattle. Three dads with kids, bored by their usual Summer activities, on their hands are credited to have invented the game. Pickelball has evolved from these Dads' homemade equipment into an international sport with commercially made equipment. Obviously, there are no kosher dills involved in the playing of the game, so why call it Pickelball? Well, one of the inventer dads owned a Cocker Spaniel named Pickles. Pickles enjoyed chasing stray balls as much as the kids enjoyed playing the game! As the game gained more players, an official name was needed, so Pickelball it was. A Pickelball court is the same size as a doubles badminton court and measures 20 x 44 feet. The court is striped simlar to a tennis court with left and right service courts. The net is roughly 36 inches high. A Pickelball paddle is smaller than a tennis racket, but larger than a ping-pong paddle. The ball is similar to a whiffle ball, with holes drilled in it. The balls are available in different colors, but should be entirely one color. Our new court, as well as the existing court, are regulation size, but players will need to provide all of their equipment, including the nets. Freestanding nets are readily available in web-based and sports equipment stores. Our Cholla Pickelballers prefer those over the fixed poles that can become dangerous. The rules of the game are carefully explained at *www.Pickelball.com*. Come to the park some afternoon to watch or join right in. They are always looking for new recruits.

# Our Own Cholla Library

Many residents of Cholla know about and use the Cholla Library, located on the west side of the Cholla Community Center. But how many know how the Library came to be the wonderful resource it is today? A few years ago the Cholla Library was an idea, a storage room, and boxes and bags of unsorted books. Barbara and Bob Dammann spearheaded a project to organize it into a real library. They, assisted by a number of other Cholla residents, spent many hours sorting materials into categories and weeding out the damaged, dirty, unusable books, DVDs, video tapes and audio books. Bob built and painted book-



shelves, which now give a bright, cheerful look to the library. Pete Peterson put in fans and lights. Many people in the community contributed time and materials to turn the dark, dirty storage room into an inviting place to find books and other materials, to sit and read, or to use the internet. My apologies go to those who helped who aren't named, as I don't have all the names. But your work is appreciated by all who use the library. However, that is not the end. The Cholla Library requires continuous upkeep and restocking. # VOTING REQUIREMENTS:

A. Eligibility to vote at the General Assembly shall be subject to the following requirements, all of which must be met:

- 1. Membership dues must be current.
- 2. All fees, federal, state and local taxes, shall be current not less than 30-days prior to the Annual Membership Meeting (General Assembly). *Please bring a receipt if taxes were paid in March or April.*
- 3. The member must hold title as defined in the Constitution to his property on the date of the Annual Meeting.

B. A member shall have one vote for each paid membership.

C. Joint and/or multiple owners of property in La Cholla shall have one vote per membership.

# VOTING:

A. Voting in Person:

Any eligible member in attendance at the Annual Meeting when called to order shall qualify to cast their vote(s) within one half-hour following the *adjournment* of the Annual Meeting. Adjournment occurs BE-FORE the question, answer and community input.

B. Voting by proxy:

Voting by proxy is permitted subject to the following requirements and conditions:

- 1. Each member may vote only one proxy per paid membership. Any member violating this procedure will have that member's ballot and all proxy ballots voted by that member voided and disallowed.
- 2. Proxies with a ballot on the back will be mailed to each member eligible to vote at the annual meeting.
- 3. Each proxy shall be notarized in the United States and shall designate the name, manzana and lot number of the member designated to vote the proxy. In the event no member designation is made, then the proxy owner shall be deemed to have appointed and authorized the Nominating Committee or its delegated representatives, to distribute the proxy to any member not holding a proxy. Proxies will be distributed according to the stamped date received. Notarized proxies will be checked for eligibility prior to the Annual Meeting and according to the date received. *Proxies may be given in person to Vecinos membership coordinator, Monica Koerner. These proxies DO NOT need to be notarized and will be also stamped according to the date received.*

C. The Election Committee and other members, as may be appointed by the Board of Directors, shall administer the collection and counting of the ballots. Members are encouraged to wait for the adjournment of the Annual Meeting to turn in ballots, other than proxies.

D. All matters to be voted on, including the election of officers and directors shall be by majority vote.

E. Voting on any matter shall be in accordance with the requirements and required percentages as set forth in the Constitution.

F. Voting results shall be formally announced in the next HOA newsletter.
