As you know, property taxes come due in January each year. I went to pay my taxes online and received quite a shock. The taxes had increased 1000% from 2022. At this point, we are not sure if it is some huge mistake or there is a large increase (10x) in taxes for 2023. We are advising that everyone stand by and not pay until we have clarification from the municipal tax department. If you pay now, there likely will not be a refund if the taxes are reduced.

We had quite a turn out at the Clubhouse on New Year's Day! We sold more than 80 stickers during the 2-5 window. The annual trash sticker may be bought through the Association or through Beni Brown's office. The Oomislim deal is \$150 for Vecinos members in good standing. Non-members may purchase a trash sticker for \$306.

The main road from Cholla Bay by the beach developments is now a through street. Drivers coming out of the desert north of the main road and drivers leaving Wrecked at the Reef must stop at the intersection.
